On 8/26/10, within less than 24 hours after the implantation, the Plaintiff was handcuffed and shackled by the U.S. Marshals, placed on an aircraft, and transferred to the Federal Medical Center - Devens (herein "FMC-Devens") located in Ayer, Massachusetts.

Upon his arrival at FMC-Devens, the Plaintiff was assigned a bed in the Special Housing Unit (SHU). Not only did the Plaintiff not have ready access to medical staff, the Plaintiff also did not receive any type of medical care or treatment for his implantation for six (6) days. The Plaintiff wasn't even even afforded basic medical care such as simple wound care/dressing changes.

On 9/1/10, the Plaintiff was awoken at approximately 3:00am because of excessive bleeding and rushed by local ambulance to the University of Massachusetts (herein "UMass") Hospital, located in Worcester, Massachusetts.

The Plaintiff was met at UMass by a team of doctors who determined that an infection and necrosis of the Plaintiff's right hand was so severe, that they recommended the Plaintiff's hand, wrist, and approximately 4" of his forearm be amputated.

This was a life threatening situation that has ever changed the Plaintiff's life, causing him permanent disability and disfigurement.
